

# Rodent Control Safety

1. Adequately train technicians regarding safety concerns of placing all types of rodent control materials.
2. Assure technicians have read and understand the labels of all rodenticide products your company uses.
3. Have a company approved list of rodent control materials and procedures. Assure all technicians have an understanding of this list and be sure your list is updated at least once per year.
4. Assure there are no rodent control materials in your storage facility which do not appear on your current approved materials list.
5. Assure all rodent stations placed at an account are logged or recorded on an account diagram, map or listed on the account documentation.
6. Assure all rodent control devices and stations your technicians place at an account are numbered and accounted for.
7. Assure all rodent stations and the rodenticide materials placed therein are adequately secured.
8. Assure you company utilizes only tamper resistant type stations and placement practices.
9. When rodent control stations & devices are to be removed from an account assure all have been accounted for.
10. Assure your technicians maintain a log indicating rodent control stations and devices have been serviced. Logs should also indicate the history of rodent activity per station/device location as well as the specific type of and amount of rodenticide utilized at the account.
11. Technicians should be trained to maintain fresh and acceptable baits.
12. Stations & devices being moved or replaced should also be noted in account documentation.
13. Technicians should be trained to avoid placing stations within easy sight of the public, whenever possible and practicable, regarding the specific account needs.
